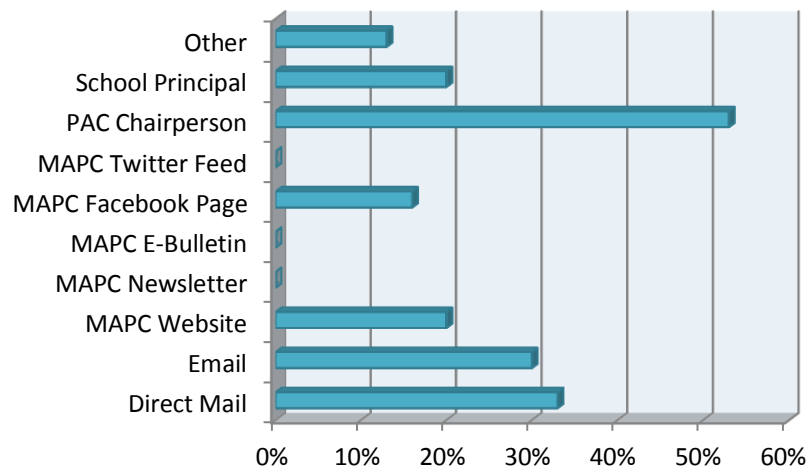




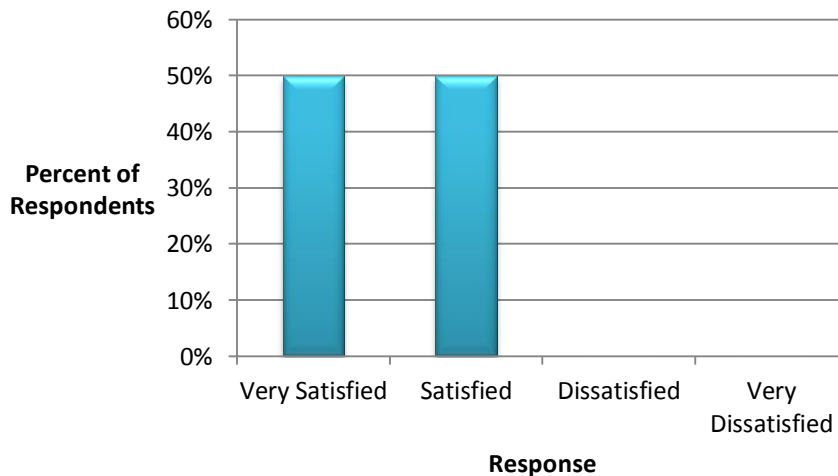

1. How did you find out about the MAPC 2014 AGM and Conference?



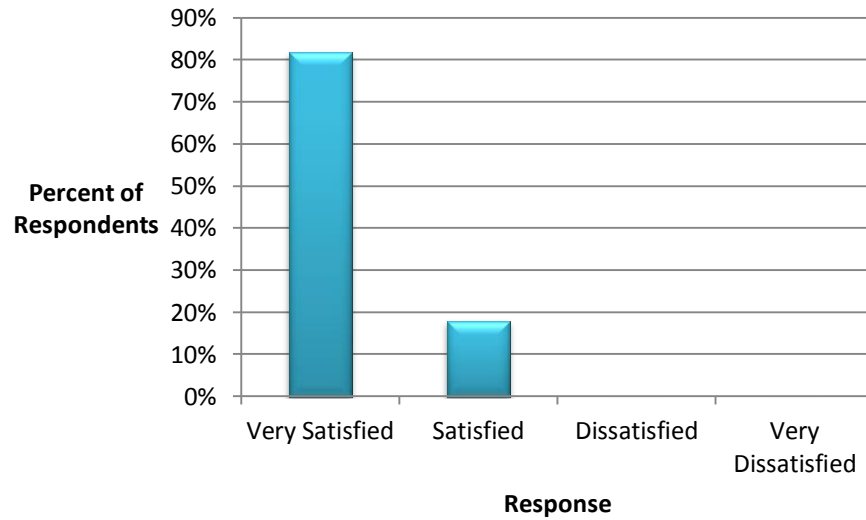

2. How satisfied were you with the conference *promotion and information material* you received?



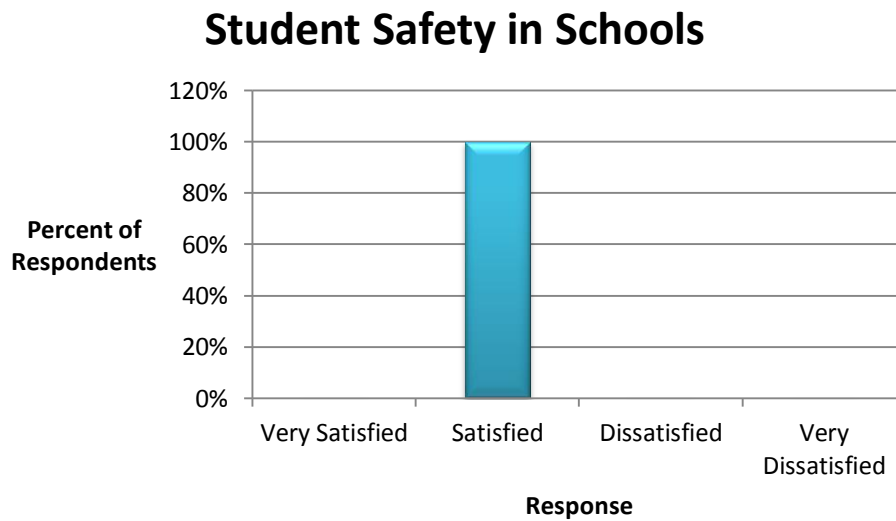
** There was a 6% increase in the amount of respondents who were "very satisfied" (2013)

3. How satisfied were you with the Friday evening Keynote presentation?

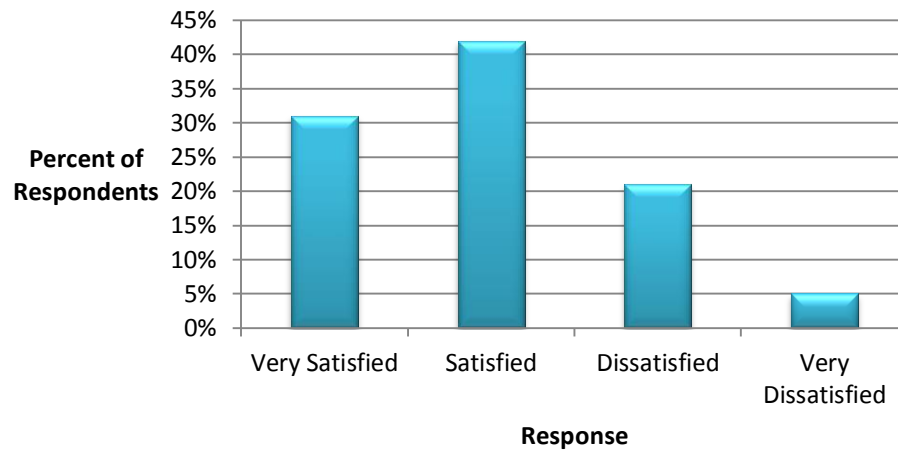


** There was a 15% decrease in the amount of respondents who were very satisfied (2013)

4. How satisfied were you with the workshop sessions at the conference?



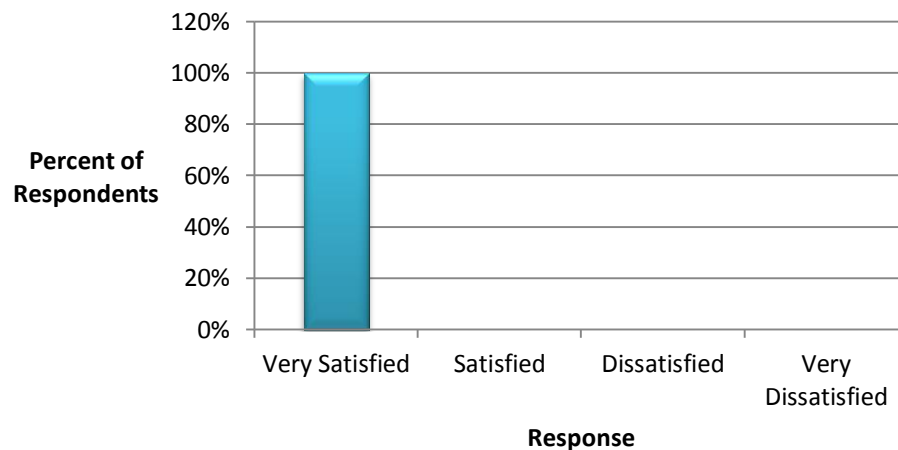
Discovering Community

- Discovering Community was not what I was expecting based on the written description. Was very good but off from “advertising” in brochure

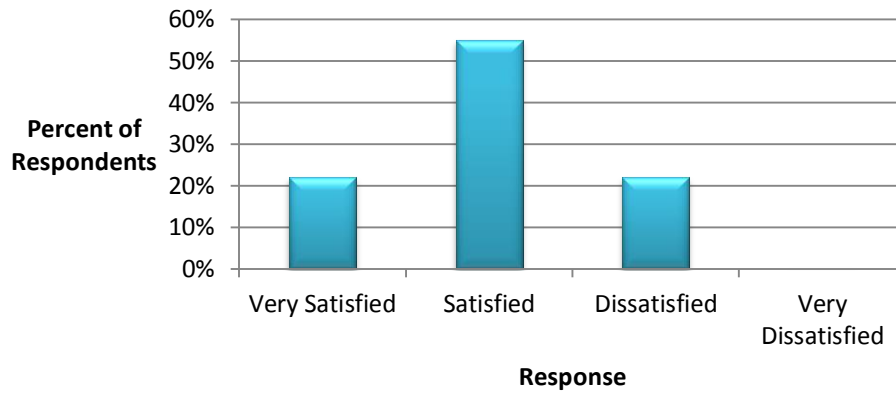
Constitutions for PACs



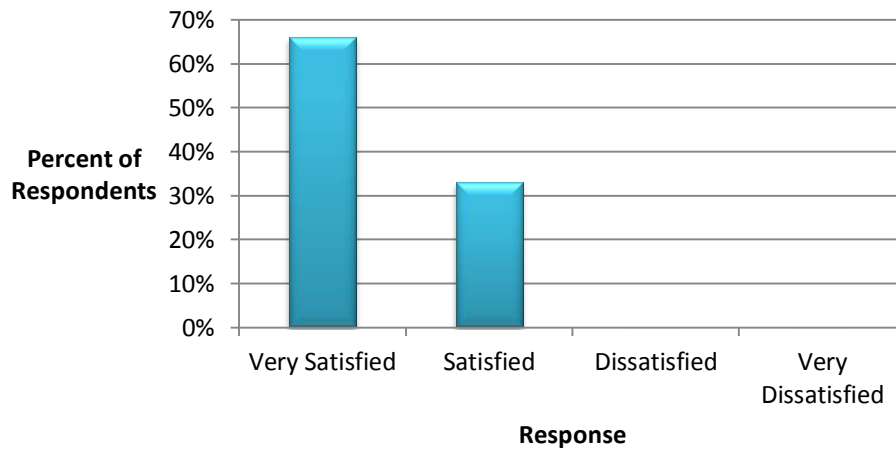
Comments

Creating Connections with School Divisions



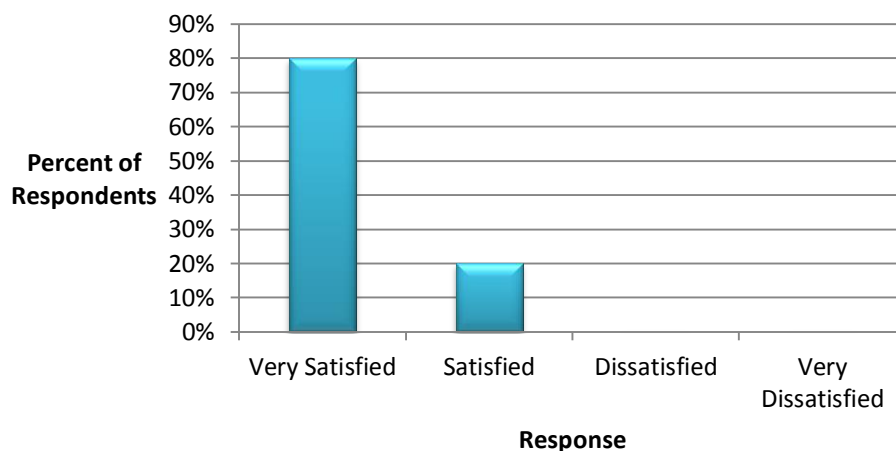
Fundraising and Grant Proposals

- The cornering of the Minister after the Q & A, rehashing Bill 18

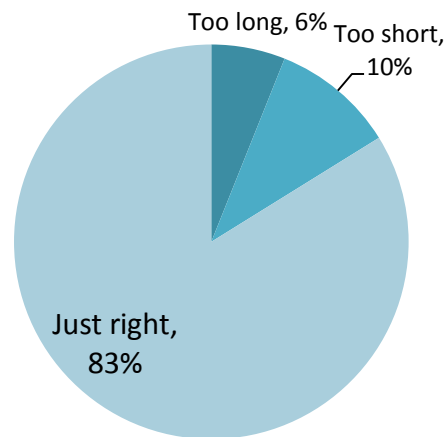
7. Were there any presenters or topics that you would like to suggest for the future?

- Do you feel that the conference and AGM are too long, too short, or just right?

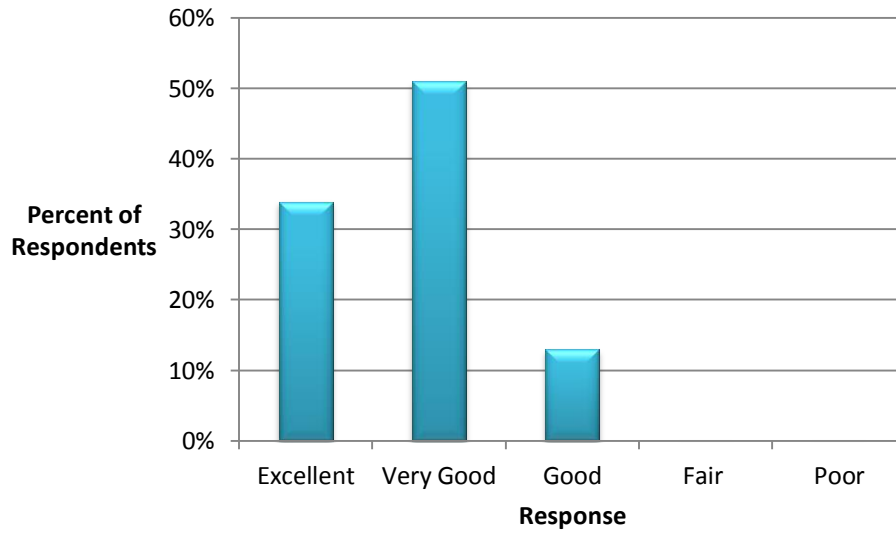


- Would you be more inclined to attend if the location was changed (i.e. Brandon or another community in Manitoba)?

9. Overall, how would you rate the 2014 MAPC Conference?



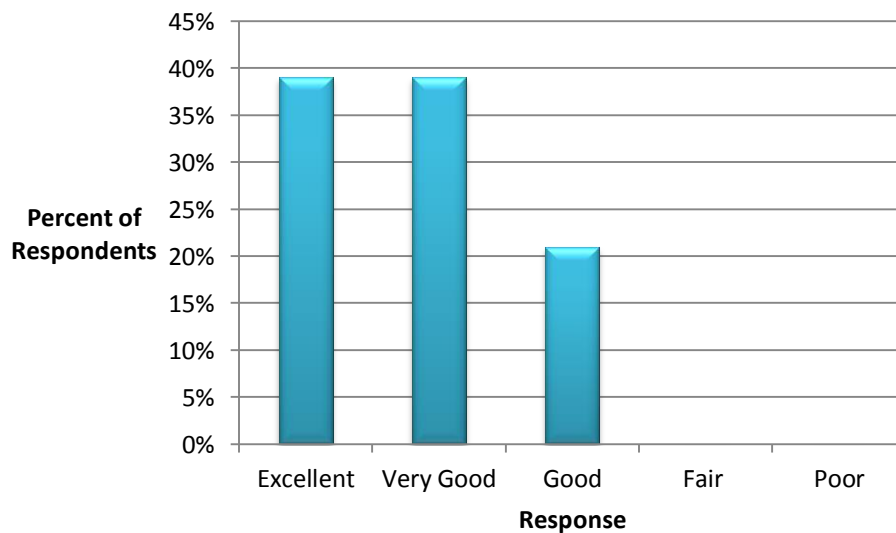
** There was a 5% increase in both the "Excellent" response and the "Very Good" response (2013)
